

# PLENARY GUEST SPEAKERS



Professor Richard John Heald "Bill" CBE, MChir, FRCS
Professor of Surgery, Basingstoke & North Hampshire NHS Trust

Professor Heald is Chairman of the Colorectal Cancer Programme at The Champalimaud Institute, Lisbon, and the Founder of the Pelican Cancer Foundation, Basingstoke Hospital, UK and Chairman of The European Academy of Robotic Colorectal Surgeons. Professor Heald's entire career has been dominated by his early publications and subsequent teaching of his lifetime work centred around his operation of "Total Mesorectal Excision". This was the first cancer operation to be based anatomically on embryological principles. Initially measured by local recurrence and eventually established as making a major impact on survival. His surgical life has been governed by a gradual process of specialisation in colorectal cancer from the 80s to the present time. He is primarily now a teacher both face to face and online explaining the detail of the TME technique. He has performed more than 600 open TME demonstrations in more than 70 countries.

# **Professor Peter Sagar**Professor of Colorectal Surgery, University of Leeds

Professor Sagar has been involved in the laparoscopic management of colon and rectal disease since its inception and currently runs an active training and research fellowship. He was awarded the Hunterian Professorship by The Royal College of Surgeons of England in 2012 and was made Professor of Colorectal Surgery in 2018. He is also a member of The Court of Examiners, Speciality Advisory Committee (General Surgery) and Associate Training Programme Director (Yorkshire & Humber). Professor Sagar is also a Council member of the Royal College of Surgeons and Past-President of the Association of Coloprocology of Great Britain and Ireland.

# Professor Mike Dixon, OBE

Professor of Surgery, University of Edinburgh and Consultant Surgeon, NHS Lothian and Edinburgh Breast Unit

Professor Dixon has championed the use of autologous fat grafting or lipofilling in breast surgery. He was the first person in the world to perform breast conserving surgery with immediate lipofilling and the first person to perform an LD flap reconstruction with immediate fat grafting. He has a huge experience of the technique in a wide range of conditions.

Professor Dixon has published over 330 papers, contributed 130 book chapters, and written or edited 25 books. Professor Dixon has given over 200 invited lectures around the world. He was inaugural editor of the Breast and served on the BMJ editorial committee.

# **PLENARY GUEST SPEAKERS**



Miss Jennifer Rusby Consultant Breast Oncoplastic Surgeon at Royal Marsden Hospital

Miss Jennifer Rusby is a Consultant Oncoplastic Breast Surgeon at the Royal Marsden Hospital Breast Unit in Sutton. She qualified at Oxford University and undertook her surgical training in Wessex, Birmingham and at The Royal Marsden.

She has spent time at Massachusetts General Hospital in Boston, USA, researching the anatomy and pathology of the nipple with the aim of improving surgical techniques to allow nipple-sparing mastectomy. In 2009 she was awarded a Royal College of Surgeons Arnott Lectureship for this work.

Miss Rusby's practice covers the diagnosis and surgical treatment of symptomatic and screen-detected breast cancer including oncoplastic breast conserving techniques and mastectomy (including nipple-sparing) with immediate breast reconstruction.

Miss Rusby is a GenerationQ Fellow & Consultant at the Royal Marsden Hospital. She is responsible for the delivery of a rapid, high-quality breast diagnostic service. She has developed the breast surgical research programme at the Trust, focusing on measurement and prediction of appearance after breast cancer surgery and new techniques for guiding surgeons removing small cancers. Through GenerationQ, Jennifer is hoping to disseminate her learning and use her skills to lead improvement among all staff.

Miss Jennifer Rusby will be presented with the 2022 Ernest Miles Commemorative Award.



# **Professor Mark Emberton**

Professor of Interventional Oncology, University College London Hospitals

Mark Emberton is Professor of Intervention Oncology within the Division of Surgery and Dean of the Faculty of Medical Science at University College London. He is clinically active and holds the position of Honorary Consultant Urologist at University College London Hospitals NHS Trust where he works as a specialist in prostate cancer.

His academic work has focused on developing novel diagnostic strategies and new therapies for men with prostate cancer. His research has resulted in the transformation of both the diagnostic and therapeutic pathways. These have been incorporated into international guidelines.

He has published over 500 peer review papers, holds a large grant portfolio, and lectures widely around the world and holds international honorary professorships.

He is a founding Pioneer of the charity Prostate Cancer UK.

Professor Mark Emberton will be presented with the RCS's 2022 Sir Stanford Cade Commemorative Award.

# BASO Keynote Lecture: Challenges in Training in Surgical Oncology

Isabel T. Rubio is the Head of Breast Surgical Oncology at Clinica Universidad de Navarra and Professor of Surgery at the University of Navarra in Madrid, Spain. She trained for two years as a Breast Surgical Oncology Fellow at The University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Arkansas Cancer Center at Little Rock, USA and for one year at the MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas, USA. She completed her PhD in 2000. She is the director of the Breast Surgery Fellowship program at her Institution.

Dr. Rubio is active in many societies, as President (2022-2024) of the European Society of Surgical Oncology (ESSO), President of EUSOMA (European Society of Breast Cancer Specialists) (2020-2023), member of the Executive Committee at the European Cancer Organization (2020-2024), founding member and past President of the Spanish Association of Breast Surgeons (AECIMA), Board member of EUBREAST, and member of the SSO and the American Society of Breast Surgeons.

She is associate editor in Breast of the Journal of Surgical Oncology, and reviewer for The Breast, the European Journal of Surgical Oncology and the Annals of Surgical Oncology. Dr. Rubio has published over 130 peer review manuscripts and many book chapters.

# BASO Keynote Lecture: Acute peri-operative intervention to prevent chronic metastatic disease

Dr. Rajendra Badwe, currently, Director, Tata Memorial Centre, has more than 34 years of diverse experience as a Surgeon and Oncologist, and as Director, has lead Tata Memorial Centre, a world renowned institution in the field of cancer care. He is an international opinion leader in oncology, developing breast cancer care strategies, innovative research, integrating delivery systems, improving quality and cancer management programs and capacity building of staff on cancer care delivery strategy and practice issues. His significant accomplishments in leadership in cancer care are a testimony to his role as a mentor in developing the cancer care strategy for Government of India and WHO. His pioneering work on 'Timing of Surgery for Breast Cancer' has induced a paradigm shift towards importance of events at the time of surgery. He is a frequent traveler and speaker in no. of national and international meetings and has more than 167 publications to his credit. He is recipient of prestigious national awards, honours and gold medals.

Dr Badwe is nationally & internationally renowned & has won several awards in recognition of his stellar contributions to cancer care. He was conferred the Padma Shri by the President of India and the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Award for Excellence in Public Administration, Academics & Management, both in 2013. His international recognition includes prestigious awards from the National Cancer Institute, US & the Union for International Cancer Control (UICC) amongst others. Under his stewardship, the TMC had the honour of plenary session presentations at the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) annual meeting in two out of three years in the last decade, a feat that very few cancer centres in the world have achieved.



# BASO/ROSETREES RESEARCH GRANTS IN CANCER SURGERY

The British Association of Surgical Oncology (BASO) is pleased to announce a call for research grants in cancer surgery in partnership with the Rosetrees Trust.

The second round will be opening on 16th January 2023 with a deadline for submissions on 31st March 2023. A total of up to £50,000 per annum will be awarded. This amount would be split between one or more applicants depending on the quality of applications received. **Research grants are aimed at supporting innovative research projects in surgical oncology that will develop further towards clinical translation. We particularly welcome multidisciplinary applications and ones that demonstrate an important improvement in delivery of cancer care or improvement in surgical treatment.** Successful applications will be eligible for inclusion in the NIHR portfolio and are encouraged to gain support from a Royal College of Surgeons of England Surgical Interventional Trials Unit (SITU).

## **KEY FEATURES**

Research grants are for up to £50,000 over 1-3 years.

Priority will be given to the best-scoring project applications with matched funding in place towards directly incurred costs and those applications with clearly justified costs which have been reduced to the minimum amount necessary to deliver the project, where applicable. If you are considering applying for a research grant, please send an expression of interest to the BASO Office, including a brief summary of the proposed research, number of patients that could benefit, how your research will address the unmet clinical need in surgical oncology and what co-funding opportunities exist to support your project. Applicants or teams with a proven track record in research / publications and with original research ideas, are favoured.

### **FUNDING**

- Staff salaries. Funding can be used to fund salaries for post-doctoral research associates, research technicians and research assistants. In special cases, we may consider funding PhD stipends. In these cases, the prospective PhD student must be embedded within a larger programme of research (e.g. a clinical trial or a programme grant) and there must be a clear case that BASO / Rosetrees support will provide additional impact.
- Data management, statistical support.
- Research consumables and other running costs directly attributable to the project.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

The lead applicant will usually be a substantive UK consultant surgeon or a UK trainee on a rotation with guaranteed employment for the duration of the grant. We will favour principle applicants who are cancer surgeons (members of BASO), holding a PhD (or equivalent) and or a team with a track record of managing grants, delivering research studies and a strong publication record. Applications should recognise

the multidisciplinary nature of cancer care and encourage associate Pls to participate, when applicable.

### **EVALUATION PROCESS**

Research grants will be selected for funding based on their scientific quality as determined by external review, track record of the research team and potential to deliver patient benefit. We will prioritise applications that can provide some element of co-funding to the directly incurred costs. Applications should potentially benefit a cancer patient population and show that their research could have broader applicability in the future to a wider patient population.

All applications will be initially checked for eligibility. An initial triage by an internal scientific panel will select the best applications that will be taken forward for external review. Triage will be based on the scientific quality, clinical need, track record of research team and potential for further development and clinical translation. Selected applications will then be sent for external review. The best scored applications will be shortlisted and considered by a scientific panel who will make funding recommendations.

Panel feedback will also be offered to the applicants upon request.
